Any transfer fees must be reimbursed. The entry fee must be filled out legibly and completely. All signed entries must be made by post or by **e-mail** and have to be accompanied by a copy of the pedigree. **Stable reservations are to be made along with the entries** and will only be accepted upon receipt of 240,-/260,- EURO (including 1x bedding) per stable per horse. Entry fees and stable money will not be reimbursed after the closing date. Additional bedding and hay may be purchased on the show-ground. Equipment must be brought.

If entries are accepted after the closing date, an additional service fee of 50,- € will be charged! Any cancellation after the closing date is under the full payment (240,- or 260,-€/horse)

Necessary documents to enter a horse: Entry Form, Foals Declaration, Reservation Form, Hereditary disorders Declaration

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Open to horses that are registered at birth in a WAHO recognized studbook of a continent (or geological area) where the particular show is organized.

- breeder and owner must be person(s) with a nationality and a citizenship of one of the countries of the continent or geological area where the particular show is organized - **Europe**
- breeder and owner must be a company exclusively owned by person(s) with a nationality and a citizenship of one of the countries of the continent or geological area where the particular show is organized - **Europe**
- breeder and owner must be a Stud farm exclusively owned by person(s) with a nationality and a citizenship of one of the countries of the continent or geological area where the particular show is organized - **Europe**
- breeder and owner must be a Stud farm exclusively owned by a government (state stud) of one of the countries of the continent or geological area where the particular show is organized - **Europe**
- breeder does not need to be owner of the horse
- no co-ownership is allowed except the immediate family members
- entries of leased horses will not be accepted
- studbook registration of ownership or lease must be at least 6 months before the date of the show

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS

- Owners, who produce more than 15 foals a year (during last three years prior to the show), are not allowed to enter their horses to the show. Declaration, confirming the number of breed and registered horses during last three years, has to be signed by the horse owner and must be sent together with the Entry form.
- Individual horses are allowed to participate only at one of the EAHGC show per season, except the EAHGC Final.
- Participation at EAHGC Final is allowed to only horses qualified (1.-5.place in each class) at one of the continental/geographic area shows organized during the current year and the previous year before the EAHGC Final.
- Title Show or A Show Champion Gold and Silver medal winners are not allowed to take part in any of the EAHGC shows for the rest of that calendar year and the **two** calendar years following, unless the horse has passed from a yearling to junior, from junior to a senior category.
- **Anybody entering a horse which is not fulfilling entry conditions/restrictions or an overqualified horse, will be liable to a fine of €600. The horse will be disqualified and will be not eligible for any prize-money rewards.**

BASIC RULES

- 1) The ECAHO show rules and regulations (BB 2024) apply in their entirety (www.ecaho.org).
- 2) On submitting the entry forms, all exhibitors, their agents, and associates agree to accept these regulations and to follow the organizer's instructions
- 3) All exhibitors will accept the judges' decisions, which are limited to this show and based on the judging system laid down in the regulations. The judges are invited by the organizer, are not paid, and are not commissioned by their breed societies.
- 4) The judges' decisions are final and will not be contested. The judges are not liable for any consequences resulting from their decisions.
- 5) All horses must be free of contagious diseases and come from a non-infected stable.
- 6) They must be effectively vaccinated against equine influenza (see [ECAHO Blue Book 2024](#) – IV. Addendum). The equine passport must be presented at the show office. In case of a missing vaccination pass, or any suspicion of contagious disease, the organizer may have the horse examined by a veterinarian at the owner's costs. The organizer is

entitled to have the horse quarantined according to the veterinarian's decision. It is strongly advised to vaccinate against virus abort. ECAHO Rules for Medication Control (BB 2024) will apply.

- 7) **!! All horses older 12 months need to be tested for Equine infectious anemia (Coggins test). Test can't be older than 12 months !!**
- 8) **All horses from EU countries must be accompanied by the Health Attestation, in accordance with EU regulations no.2009/156/ES. Horses from third countries must be accompanied with the HEALTH CERTIFICATE for the temporary admission into the European Union of registered horses for a period of less than 90 days in accordance with Decision 2004/211/EC**
- 9) **ECAHO underbite/overbite certificates + stallions testicles certificates are required (see BB 2024).**
- 10) The organizer accepts no responsibility for accidents, illnesses, theft, fire, or any kind of damage, whether to people or to animals and objects, in particular, no third party liability for any damages. The owners of all horses or other animals at the show must have legal liability. Everyone is personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by himself, his associates etc., or his horses.
- 11) Start numbers will be given out at the show office for free.
- 12) There will be no compensation for transportation costs.
- 13) All horses are shown in hand. One assistant handler with a whip from the DC is allowed.

JUDGING METHOD

Three judges will judge each class independently of each other and without a catalog. Each judge gives **1-10 points with half points** for the following criteria: Type (breed and gender), Head & Neck (head separately + neck separately), Body, Legs, Movement (walk separately + trot separately).

MEDICATION CONTROL

Medication testing of all Gold Medal winners is not compulsory. Any horse may be tested at the discretion of the DC. The organizers of the show should arrange for an ECAHO approved sampling vet to be available, in case the Disciplinary Committee should request that a drug test be carried out. All medication testing will be conducted according to ECAHO Rules for Medication Control.

PRIZE MONEY AND REWARDS

Classes: 1.- 5. place in each class 5.000 AED

Championships: Trophies (Gold, Silver, Bronze)

Special award: Special award will be given to the highest scoring horse of the show.

All prize-money rewards will be transferred to the horse owners bank accounts. A list with the names of all winners and their bank details will be provided by the show organizers. Registered owner of the winning horse must be the owner of provided bank account.

CLASSES DIVISION

Division or combination of individual classes is possible, depending on the number of entered horses. Maximum number of classes with prize-money rewards is 10.

RULES FOR TIES IN QUALIFYING PLACES

In the event of a tie in the qualifying places of a class, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for type. If there is still a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for movement. Failing a decision on either of these, one judge chosen by ballot will name his preference.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Horses placed 1st and 2nd in their classes are qualified for their respective championships.

The following championships should be awarded:

Junior Female Championship
Senior Female Championship

Junior Male Championship
Senior Male Championship

RULES FOR CHAMPIONSHIP – OPEN METHOD

The Gold, Silver and Bronze medal winners will be selected from amongst all the horses which have qualified in their respective classes for each championship.

The number of horses qualified from each class will be officially announced by the show organizer in the schedule and the show catalog.

1. The Championships will be judged as follows:

- a. All the horses qualified for the championship will enter the ring and line up according to the numerical order of their catalog numbers.
- b. The horses will be judged individually, standing and trotting.
- c. Each judge will nominate his choice for gold silver and bronze medals together at the same time, from amongst all the horses qualified for the championship.

Points will be given to the nominated horses as follows:

- A horse nominated by a judge for Gold Medal will receive 4 points.
- A horse nominated by a judge for Silver Medal will receive 2 points.
- A horse nominated by a judge for Bronze Medal will receive 1 point.

The Gold Medal will be awarded to the horse with the most votes for Gold Medal Champion. In case of an equal amount of vote for Gold Medal Champion, the Gold Medal will be awarded to the horse with the highest number of championships points.

From the remaining horses:

The Silver Medal will be awarded to the horse with the highest number of championship points.

The Bronze Medal will be awarded to the horse with the 2nd highest number of championship points.

In the case of a tie, the Rules for Ties in championships will be followed.

The judges will not discuss the horses.

2. A fourth horse will be selected, which will become the Bronze medal winner should one of the three medal winners be disqualified. If this exhibit is not apparent from the voting papers, the judges will be asked to nominate one. This horse will not be announced. In the event that two or more of the medal winners are disqualified, no further substitution will be made.
3. All horses that qualify for their respective Championships must take part in the Championship. Unless a certificate from the DC veterinarian is produced, failure to compete will disqualify the horse from the show, with its record of score and class placing being deleted and the horse being disqualified from showing for the period of one year as from the date of the show. In the event of a disqualification, horses placed behind the disqualified horse will move up a place in the class. Should a horse be sent out of the ring by the judges or taken out by the handler for any reason, it will be deemed to have taken part in the championship.

4. All horses that are awarded a medal in their respective Championships must take part in the Championship prize-giving ceremony.

Unless the DC decides otherwise in which case any representative of the horse may accept the medal without the horse being present, absence of the horse or any representative to appear in the prizegiving ceremony will disqualify the horse from the show with its record of score in the class and championship placing being deleted and the horse being disqualified from the showing for the period of one year from the date of the show.

In the event of a disqualification, all horses placed behind the disqualified horse will move up one place in the Championship.

During the prize giving ceremony, the horse may only be on the lead of the designated handler or substitute deemed capable at the discretion of the ringmaster/DC.

The rules set down in the Blue Book 2024 of the EAHSC apply in every aspect. In case of doubt or differing opinions, the original English version applies. Apart from that, the following ECAHO rules apply:
